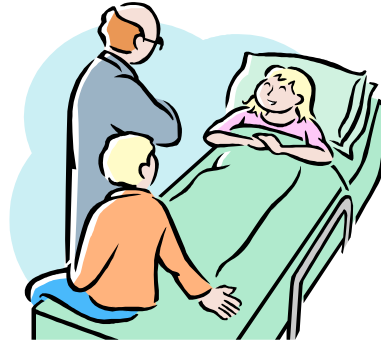
May this summertime be a time of growth, and rest; fruitfulness, and nurture; peace, and joy.

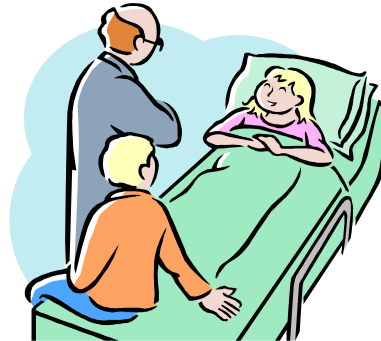
